

## **Travel Notice**

## For persons who intend travelling out of the State with an expired Irish Residence Permit (IRP) card.

## To whom it may concern,

The Minister for Justice of Ireland has put a temporary arrangement in place to permit non-nationals legally resident in Ireland travelling internationally between 06 December 2023 and 31 January 2024.

From 06 December 2023, persons living in Ireland with an Irish Residence Permit (IRP) card that has recently expired (up to 8 weeks) may use this expired card as proof of their entitlement to re-enter the State until 31 January 2024.

This entitlement applies to persons who have submitted an application to renew their IRP card before its expiry date. A receipt of an application to renew, which notes the date of application, will provide proof that the person has applied to renew their registration prior to their current IRP card expiring.

Persons intending to travel under these arrangements should print this notice and present it, along with their expired IRP card, and proof of renewal application to immigration authorities and airline carriers, as requested.

However, where a current permission of residence in Ireland had expired prior to submitting an application for renewal, those persons are considered to be out of permission. The entitlement to use an expired IRP card for re-entry to the State will not apply to those persons.

Persons with a single entry visa for Ireland and a prior landing stamp will require a visa to travel back to Ireland should they chose to leave the State.

Persons with a valid in-date multi-entry visa for Ireland are entitled to travel and re-enter the State.
