

# Application for permission to remain in the State on the basis of marriage/civil partnership with an Irish National

This application form is for non-EEA nationals who are married to an Irish National and living in the State.

### You should use the form if

- You are married to/in a civil partnership with an Irish National, and
- You and your spouse/civil partner are in the State, and
- You have been refused registration at your local immigration office and referred to make an application to ISD.

## How to complete the form

- Fill in the form using a computer, smartphone, or tablet, and save the changes.
- All sections must be completed and documentation provided as required. Where indicated,
   please place a tick in the appropriate box.
- All declarations must be signed. Typed signatures are accepted.
- Please note that copies of certain documents are required to be submitted with this form. Please refer to the checklist in Section 8 of this form. We can only accept PDF, JPEG
- and PNG file types up to 5MB for each portal comment (Original documents may be requested at a later stage if required when finalising the application).
- If you are unable to provide any of the information or details requested please provide a written explanation indicating the reasons for this in Section 7 of this form.

### Incomplete application forms will not be processed and your application will be refused.

- Applications are dealt with in strict chronological order of receipt. A decision may take up to 12 months from the date of receipt of a fully completed application form.
- While your application is being processed you must advise us of any change in your circumstances (including of residence, marital status, address, or change in activities of the Irish spouse). You must submit new supporting documentation as appropriate.

#### Introduction

  - Processing in respect of your application for an immigration permission, or for an application made on behalf of a minor.
  - As part of any future considerations regarding the applicant's immigration or status.

### Legal Basis for processing your Personal Data

- 3. Our legal basis for collecting and processing this data is as follows:
  - To protect the integrity of the immigration process and to ensure that the proper enactment of the De facto scheme (policy document) is complied with.
  - To fulfil the function of the Minister for Justice (Management of inward migration to the State (Immigration)) as designated in the Ministers and Secretaries Act 1924 (as amended).

### **Further processing of your Personal Data**

4. Where it is necessary and proportionate to do so, in accordance with the Data Protection Act 2018 and the GDPR, further personal data may be requested or received from/provided to other Public Authorities/competent authorities<sup>1</sup>

Any other body or entity authorised by law to exercise public authority and public powers for the international organisations for the purpose of ensuring the effective and efficient operation of the immigration services of Ireland, which fulfils an important public interest. The personal data you provide in this form and in associated correspondence is necessary for us to process the application and to issue a decision, whether for you or on behalf of a minor. ### Your Rights in relation to your Personal Data
