Travel Confirmation Notice –

For customers who intend travelling with an expired Irish Residence Permit (IRP) card.

To whom it may concern,

The Irish Minister for Justice has put a temporary arrangement in place to permit nonnationals legally resident in Ireland travelling internationally between 08 December 2025 and 31 January 2026.

From 08 December, non-nationals living in Ireland with an Irish Residence Permit (IRP) card that has recently expired may use this expired card as proof of their entitlement to reenter the State until 31 January 2026.

These individuals should be allowed to travel on the expired IRP card where an application to renew was submitted in advance of the expiry date. A receipt of application which details the date of application and OREG number will provide proof that they have applied to renew their registration prior to their current IRP card expiring.

If, however, their current permission expired prior to submitting an application for renewal, they are considered out of permission and this notice will not apply.

Passengers with a single entry visa and a prior landing stamp will require a re-entry visa to travel back to Ireland. Passengers with a valid in-date multi-entry visa are cleared to travel.

Customers intending to travel under these arrangements should print this notice and present it, along with their expired IRP card, and proof of renewal application to immigration authorities and airline carriers, as requested.
