

Residential Proof Affidavit

Citizenship by Naturalisation



Important guidance to complete this form

- This form should only be completed if you can not reach the required 150 points for proof of one or more years of residence. You must complete this form fully and submit it with your citizenship application.
- This affidavit must be signed in the presence of an Authorised Certifier which is a Practising Solicitor, Commissioner for Oaths, Peace Commissioner or a Notary Public.

Affidavits are only accepted in exceptional circumstances where a required document cannot reasonably be obtained. Submitting an affidavit where a document is available may result in your application being delayed.

What you need



Completing the Residential Proof affidavit

The applicant must:

- Print the affidavit
- Complete the affidavit remembering to leave the applicant declaration blank as this section must be witnessed
- Bring a form of photo ID and this form to an Authorised Certifier
- Sign the affidavit in their presence



What will the Authorised Certifier do

The Authorised Certifier will:

- Confirm your identity
- Ask you to sign the affidavit in their presence
- Complete and sign the certification section of the form



Uploading the documents

You will need to:

- Scan the completed certified form
- Ensure that they are clear and legible
- Log in to your online forms account and upload the document



Submission Checklist

Before uploading your document to the online application portal, check the following:

- The Authorised Certifier has confirmed your identity.
- The Authorised Certifier has certified that the affidavit was signed by you in their presence.
- The Authorised Certifier has completed and signed the certification form.
- The document is clear and legible.
